The average lifespan for a cell phone is a brief eighteen months, and currently, only 1% are recycled. On average, 130 million are retired annually in the U.S. alone, and there are now an estimated 500 million used mobile phones in the U.S. sitting on shelves or in our landfills. This mountain of toxic waste poses a major threat to the environment, and an equally large opportunity to re-channel these devices into productive reuse. Recycled cell phones are used for social programs providing emergency-only services, or in less developed countries where there are no land lines. Obsolete phones are destroyed in an environmentally responsible manner with 100% landfill diversion. **Recycling your phone costs you nothing and contributes to the well-being of our planet.**
